ORDINANCE 10-2019

AN ORDINANCE APPROVING ENTERING INTO AGREEMENT
FOR PROVISION OF POLICE SERVICES IN PROSPECT PARK

Whereas, Navarre Facility, LLC ("Navarre Facility") and Hendrickson U. S. A., LLC ("Hendrickson") have announced their intention to construct and staff a new industrial facility at 4500 Sterilite Street NE, Navarre, Ohio, new Out Lot 905 (tax parcel 10011395), in the Prospect Park industrial park, and

Whereas, the Village of Navarre seek to encourage industrial development in the Prospect Park industrial park, as it will bring new jobs and investment to Stark County, and


Whereas, under a certain joint economic development agreement dated August 8, 1996, and a certain annexation agreement dated November 19, 2007, both with Perry Township, police services within that portion of Prospect Park (which includes Stark County tax parcels 10011394, 10011395, and 10011396) that also lies within Perry Township will be provided by Perry Township, and

Whereas, the Village of Navarre police department is capable of providing police protection to that part of Prospect Park that also lies within Perry Township, and such police protection from the Village of Navarre police department would provide that area with more frequent patrols and quicker response times, with Perry Township providing mutual aid as required,

Now, therefore, be it ordained by the Council of the Village of Navarre, Ohio, that

(1) That the Village of Navarre shall enter into an agreement for provision of police services in Prospect Park with Perry Township, upon such terms deemed legal by the Village's Solicitor, and Mayor Benson shall be authorized to sign such agreement upon behalf of the Village of Navarre

(2) This ordinance shall take effect at the earliest time permitted by law. This ordinance is deemed an EMERGENCY, not requiring three readings, the Emergency being that determination of the priority of providers of police services is critical to the safety of the Hendrickson development, including during the construction phase, and should therefore be passed as an EMERGENCY, with the number of votes necessary to waive the three readings rule and adopt this measure as an EMERGENCY.
