ORDINANCE NO. 4-2020

AN ORDINANCE ENACTING AND ADOPTING SUPPLEMENT
TO VILLAGE OF NAVARRE CODE OF MUNICIPAL REGULATIONS, SAID
SUPPLEMENT PUBLISHED BY AMERICAN LEGAL PUBLISHING
CORPORATION AND KNOWN AS THE OHIO BASIC CODE

Whereas, American Legal Publishing Corporation of Cincinnati, Ohio has completed the 2020 supplement to the Code of Ordinances known as the Ohio Basic Code, intended as a supplement to the Codified Municipal Regulations of the Village of Navarre, which supplement contains ordinances of a general nature enacted since the prior supplement to the Ohio Basic Code adopted previously by the Village of Navarre, and


Whereas, American Legal Publishing Corporation has recommended revision or addition of certain sections of the Ohio Basic Code which are based on or make references to sections of the Ohio Revised Code, and

Whereas, it is the intent of Village Council to accept these updated sections in accordance with the changes in the Ohio Revised Code,

Now Therefore, the Village Council of Navarre, Ohio Ordains as follows:

Section 1 – That the 2020 supplement to the Ohio Basic Code, as submitted by American Legal Publishing Corporation of Cincinnati, the table of contents of which is attached hereto, be and the same is hereby adopted by reference as if set out in its entirety, provided, however, that if any provision in the 2020 supplement to the Ohio Basic Code conflicts with any Village of Navarre Codified Municipal Regulation, that the Codified Municipal Regulation shall control and apply.

Section 3 – That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its adoption by Council and approval by the Mayor. Further, Council deems passage of this ordinance to be an emergency so that Village law will be as up to date as similar provisions in other Ohio municipalities, creating a uniformity that will assist persons dealing with multiple jurisdictions; thus this ordinance is passed by the super-majority required for emergency ordinances, and to waive the usual three readings requirement.
